The committee will be presenting several recommendations for a vote by the general membership at the picnic gathering. They include:

An organizational structure allowing for full membership in the Sheep Mountain Alliance at \$35 per year (\$11 for low income persons) and participation in a Friend of Sheep Mountain support group without voting privileges at \$5 per year.

Affiliation with the Montrosebased consumer group, the Western Colorado Congress.

Election of officers to a board of directors.

The steering committee will be recommending approval of the

first two items as part of SMA's organizational structure, as well as offering nominations for seven board seats, including president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer.

One of the board representatives will also be designated as a WCC senator from SMA, if approved by the general membership.

Ads have been running in the Times-Journal for SMA memberships, and all who have responded have received bright green "Save Sheep Mountain" bumperstickers, which have begun to sprout on local vehicles.

Those interested in coming, who haven't been contacted already, are asked to bring a covered dish for the potluck picnic, which will precede the meeting.

Steering committee member Jack Pera will lead anyone interested on hikes into the Sheep Mountain area on Sunday. For more info, call Pera at 728-4132.
